Layne Pennington led the Pledge to the Flag.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 5:03 p.m.

PUBLIC HEARING

ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT TO ALLOW RACETRACKS

The Lee County Board of Supervisors held a Public Hearing on February 21, 2012 at 5:00 p.m. in the General District Courtroom of the Lee County Courthouse located in Jonesville, Virginia to solicit input on a proposed Zoning Text Amendment. A Zoning Text Amendment has been requested to allow Racetracks in the A-1, Agricultural district by Special Use Permit with the following restrictions:

- Minimum lot size of 35 acres
- Hours of operation shall be between sunrise and 11:00 p.m.
- All outdoor lighting shall be turned off between 11:00 p.m. and sunrise, except lighting used for walkways, roads, parking lots and security. In these cases, fully shielded lights must be used. Lights should not shine into the sky or onto neighboring properties.
- The lot will have access to an arterial street
- A fence with a minimum height of five (5) feet shall be maintained around the track to keep spectators from entering the track.
- The track surface shall be maintained so as to minimize dust.

The Chairman opened the floor for public comment.

Michael James, Community Development Director, advised that the Planning Commission had voted to not recommend approval of the proposed zoning text amendment. He stated there were several objections to the amendment from the public.

Jason Miles, Maple Hill Community, stated the amendment did not require setbacks, water studies, noise surveys or other studies to determine the feasibility of a racetrack. He stated this type establishment was not needed in Lee County. He requested the Board not approve the text amendment.

Clarence Stafford stated he was opposed to racetracks in the County. He stated there were no studies on water and sewage availability to the property or drainage issues.

There was no other public comment.

The County Administrator advised that Tracy Garrett had called to oppose the text amendment.

The Chairman closed the floor for public comment.

Mr. Crabtree stated he believed an error in notification had created some confusion. He stated notice to adjacent property owners would not be required until the use is allowed by text amendment. He asked if this interpretation was correct.

The County Administrator advised that this was the correct interpretation.

Mr. Slemp asked why we were rezoning the entire county.

The County Administrator advised that this was not a rezoning but rather adding an allowed use to the A-1 District.

RETURN PROPOSED TEXT AMENDMENT TO PLANNING COMMISSION

It was moved by Mr. Crabtree, seconded by Ms. Rowe, to send the proposed Zoning Text Amendment to allow Racetracks back to the Planning Commission for further study. The Planning Commission should specifically address setback requirements and minimum acreage as well as other pertinent issues. Upon the question being put the vote was as follows. VOTING AYE: Mr. Bailey, Mr. Crabtree, Mr. Mosley, Ms. Rowe, Mr. Slemp

Prior to the vote, Mr. Crabtree commented that, if allowed, the ordinance should address large or small operations and be detailed enough to do so.

REBECCA HAYNES SPECIAL USE PERMIT REQUEST

The Lee County Board of Supervisors held a Public Hearing on February 21, 2012 at 5:00 p.m. in the General District Courtroom of the Lee County Courthouse located in Jonesville, Virginia to solicit input on a Special Use Permit request. Rebecca Haynes has applied for a Special Use Permit for an auto salvage yard in an A-1, Agricultural district. The property is located near Pennington Gap in the Right Hand Poor Valley community and consists of 3.35 acres.

The Chairman opened the floor for public comment.

Michael James, Community Development Director, advised that the Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the Special Use Permit. He reported there had been no objections received to date. He also advised that an auto salvage yard may not expressly be applicable to the request as the planned use is to store vehicles for further salvage off-site.

Board Members asked questions regarding the difference in a junkyard and a salvage lot, whether a fence was required and if the setbacks would be the same as for other uses in the A-1, Agricultural District.

Mr. James advised that neither junkyard nor salvage lot are currently defined in the Zoning Ordinance. He stated a fence was not currently required unless by state or federal law, and setbacks would be the same as for other uses.

Rebecca Haynes stated that the proposed use is to store vehicles for delivery to a crusher. She stated they usually have 8-10 cars on site at any one time. They may occasionally accumulate more than that over a weekend.

There was no other public comment.

The Chairman closed the floor for public comment.

REBECCA HAYNES SPECIAL USE PERMIT

It was moved by Ms. Rowe, seconded by Mr. Mosley, to approve the Rebecca Haynes Special Use Permit to allow an auto salvage yard in an A-1, Agricultural District with the stipulations that there be no more than 30 cars on site at any one time and that the vehicles be shielded and not visible from public view. Upon the question being put the vote was as follows.

DELEGATIONS

VDOT ADMINISTRATIVE CHANGES ALLEN SUMPTER RESIDENT ADMINISTRATOR

Allen Sumpter, Wise Residency Administrator, addressed the Board regarding upcoming changes in the Residency structure. He stated the Wise Residency manages four counties with 122 employees of which approximately 40 are in Lee County. All road maintenance in Lee County is performed from the Ewing or Dryden Area Maintenance Headquarters. He advised that the changes would bring all maintenance under the Residency as well as formulation of the Secondary Six-Year Plan. Mr. Sumpter commented on recent issues including litter and expressed his appreciation for the Sheriff's Department's cooperation in overseeing inmates to clean several miles of highway. He also advised that trees overhanging the road on Route 352 could not always be easily removed as they have a limited right-or-way in many areas and have to obtain permission from private property owners to enter their property to remove trees. Various areas of guardrail damage throughout the county are hoped to be repaired in the near future. Mr. Sumpter advised that reconstruction of Route 647 is under winter shutdown and that projects on Routes 686 and 660 should begin in May. He stated that he would attempt to attend Board Meetings on a quarterly basis and expects to address the Secondary Six-Year Plan with the Board in about three months.

Mr. Crabtree asked about the process for obtaining Children At Play signs, speed studies and broken highway shoulders.

Mr. Sumpter advised that requests for signage could go to the County Administrator to be forwarded to his office. Requests for speed studies should come with a formal vote of the Board. He advised that public works projects that affect the shoulders are under permit and would be referred back to the permitted agency or contractor. ------

Ms. Rowe asked about planned paving projects in the County and stated that some portions of Alternate Route 58 in downtown Pennington Gap were rough.

Mr. Mosley thanked Mr. Sumpter for his attention to the Board's concerns in the past. He restated his concerns about the lack of a traffic signal on Alternate Route 58 at Route 645 in Ben Hur.

Mr. Sumpter stated that Federal standards regarding traffic signal needs do not warrant limited use signals such as the one Ben Hur.

DANIEL BOONE SOIL AND WATER DISTRICT REPORT ROGER ELKINS, MEMBER BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Roger Elkins, Member of the Board of Directors, presented a report on the activities of the Daniel Boone Soil and Water Conservation District. He advised they have received a total allocation of \$573,000 this year for erosion and water quality protection projects. They conduct annual pasture walks to educate local farmers on methods to improve their farms. They also work with the schools to educate children on conservation practices. The District is also working with the Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy to correct acid mine drainage problems at abandoned mine sites. They are also working with DMME and other partners to establish an outdoor classroom at the Stone Creek tipple site. Mr. Elkins expressed his appreciation to the Board for their support of the Soil and Water Conservation District.

Mr. Crabtree expressed his appreciation for the work of the District to help farmers promote conservation.

Mr. Bailey thanked Mr. Elkins for the District's efforts.

Mr. Poe advised it had been twenty years since the County's ordinances had been codified.
