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Donna Stanley, Planning District 1 Behavioral Health Services, provided the Board with the Return on Investment Report. The District has served 5,483 consumers, created 213 jobs with 32 of those jobs being in Pennington Gap, for a total output of over \$13,000,000. Ms. Stanley thanked the Board for continued support to Behavioral Health Services.

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Mr. Poe stated that there has not been a budget work session since the latest update was received for Planning District 1, Behavioral Health Services. There has been a change in the way the State calculates the total match, and due to that the local match for Lee County has increased from \$94,500.00 to \$100,547.00.

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Ms. Stanley stated that previously the regional funding was taken out of the calculations for the local match, but that is no longer being done and the local match has increased accordingly.

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## DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

#### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Mike James, Economic Development Director, reported that he has met with five potential business owners over the past few months; assisting local entrepreneurs with job creation will continue to be one of the top priorities. He stated that construction should be finished on the Research and Development facility at Lone Mountain and the plant should be operating this week, and that the new sewer project in the Western end of the County should help to bring in some additional developments. The State is developing a program for 100 contiguous acre sites, throughout the VCEDA region there may not be any that size, and VCEDA decided to focus on the best sites they can come up with. He is also working on a multi-employer job fair in August. He reported that his department had issued 33 Zoning permits and 4 Variances and he had made 6 property visits.

## FREEMAN VANDERGRIFF PENNINGTON GAP RESCUE SQUAD

Freeman Vandergriff, presented that Board with the records that were requested at a previous meeting. In 2013 after the hospital closed there were over 33,000 miles ran, \$7,000 in fuel and \$11,000 in repairs, so far in 2015 there have been 699 calls, 25,000 miles and \$14,000 in fuel and repair costs.

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Mr. Slemp asked where funding came from.

Mr. Vandergriff stated that several years ago the State of Virginia starting allowing Rescue Squads to bill insurance companies, and that is where a lot of that money comes from.

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Mr. Bailey asked what exactly the Rescue Squad is asking of the Board.

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Mr. Bailey stated that the Board would discuss the matter later and make a decision.

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## BOBBY BURCHETT / JERRY INGLE DANIEL BOONE SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION

Mr. Ingle reported that the DCR has allocated money to finish 2014 projects in the amount of \$611,286.53. The environmental impact of the conservation practices is moving Lee County in the medium range instead of the high range. He added that with increase in work there will need to be an increase of funding, and asked the Board to increase the local appropriation to support a full time position.

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Roger Elkins added that this is more of an economic sustainability. We were able to obtain money because the staff had projects ready.

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#### **SPEARHEAD TRAILS**

Mr. Poe reported that Spearhead Trails are requesting an additional \$10,000 to assist them with patrolling and maintaining the Stone Mountain Trail System for the next fiscal year. The total cost will be \$40,000 to \$50,000 in the first year. The Town of Pennington Gap has already committed up to \$25,000 to assist with operations.

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#### **NEW GARBAGE TRUCK**

The Transfer Station Superintendant has already gotten bid specs for a new garbage truck, which is in the budget for next year. Mr. Poe stated that he would like to go ahead and advertise now, but not make the purchase until July or August.

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It was the consensus of the Board to advertise for bids for a new garbage truck.

**COPS TECHNOLOGY GRANT** 

Mr. Poe reported that the County had been awarded another 18-month extension on the COPS Technology Grant.

Mr. Crabtree asked about the installation of the 911 Road signs.

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Mr. Poe stated he has not able to get with Mr. Bailey on that, he will get with him by the end of the week.

Mr. Crabtree asked Mr. Poe to get with Mr. Fleenor about the illegal dumpsite in Hagan.

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Mr. Poe stated that he would check with Mr. Fleenor.

Mr. Crabtree asked if Mr. Poe was able to gather information with the Cope family.

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Mr. Poe stated he has hit a dead end with everybody, and without knowing the family members names, he does not know how to locate them.

Mr. Mosley recommends advertising for the positions that we received resignations for.

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## **BRIDGE ON 58**

Mr. Mosley stated that the river bridge on Route 58 will be replaced soon, and he would like to discuss putting in a boat ramp with VDOT.

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## JASPER CONVENIENCE CENTER

Mr. Slemp stated that he had received a call about the convenience center in Jasper, regarding a recycling building.

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Mr. Poe stated he had received an email about the lack of a recycling barn. It is a pretty small site and a barn may not fit.

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## **BOAT RAMP AT DRYDEN**

Mr. Slemp stated that there are two big logs that have floated down and is making it hard to get boats in the water, and trash is starting to accumulate.

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Mr. Poe stated that it is not a County ramp, but he would look into it.

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#### WEBSITE

Ms. Rowe stated that back in 2012 there was discussion about getting the County Ordinances and County Codes put on the website. It would be good if we could have those on there.

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## COMCAST

Ms. Rowe asked if Mr. Poe was able to get in touch with Comcast.

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Mr. Poe stated he has not been able to but he will keep trying.

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#### E-911 SOCIAL MEDIA

Ms. Rowe asked if Mr. Bailey was working on an E-911 Social Media Site.

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Mr. Poe stated that Mr. Bailey is working on upgrading his cell phone so that he can update it from his phone.

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## TOWER IN WESTERN LEE

Ms. Rowe asked if the COPS grant could be used for a tower.

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Mr. Poe stated that the County's project includes contruction of an emergency communication tower.

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## TRAILS

Ms. Rowe stated that they are aggressively working on the trail systems, and now there is a concern of not being able to get cell service on some parts of the trail.

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Mr. Poe stated that getting cell towers is consumer driven, and providers typically cover major highway corridors.
