DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

ANIMAL CONTROL

Allen Fortner, Animal Control Officer, reported that for the months of September and October his department received 380 calls at the Pound and 149 calls through the

Sheriff's Department for a total of 529 calls. His department picked up 34 strays, had 59 owner surrenders, 3 bite cases, 1 seized with 13 being reclaimed, 5 adopted, 69 transferred to rescue, 6 euthanized and 1 died in the facility. They issued 46 summonses, \$1,550.00 in fines and restitution, \$92 collected for holding fees for a total of \$1,642.00. The officers attended training in Lebanon with USDA Wildlife Services. The USDA Wildlife Services dropped a rabies inoculation and they asked that the departments assist them in collecting samples of wildlife. It is a \$20,000,000.00 project that the State has invested in, trying to push rabies to the East Coast to eradicate it. He stated that the State has sent down multiple changes on Shelter Operations and he is waiting for the State Veterinarian because she would be able to help understand the changes. He will get back to the Board once she comes and explains things better. He added that he is starting to get complaints about the cat problems in the County.

LITTER CONTROL

Josh Fleenor, Litter Control Coordinator, stated that for the month of October there were 159 people in the Community Service Program with 103 participating for a total of 1,361 hours. He is getting ready to start working on some of the illegal dumpsites. He worked on some illegal dumping on Veteran's Day and will work on issuing tickets on that. He has been working on the complaints and some of the cleanup is underway.

SOLID WASTE

Gary Collingsworth, Transfer Station Superintendent, reported that there were 1,166.63 tons of garbage and 14.41 tons of tires brought into the Transfer Station. The

department has been working on routine maintenance, clearing brush at the Convenience Centers, and graded some of the sites. There are still fence repairs to be done and a few dumpster fire repairs to be made. He stated that the electric fence at the Keokee Center seems to have done the job and the bear sightings are down, however, there are now bears at other sites and an electric fence might help at these sites as well. Most of the repairs on the new building have been resolved and should be finished in the next couple of weeks. Construction for the new Forestry shed will begin as soon as Mr. Cope is able to get a crew down to help with that.


