DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Allen Fortner, Animal Control Officer, requested that the part time employee position be made into a full time position to help in the following areas; overwhelming number of calls, responding in a timely manner, help eliminate comp time and help with the enforcement of litter violations while answering animal calls. He added that he has tried to handle some litter complaints the past few weeks and has given a few 30 day warnings.

Mr. Smith asked what happens after 30 days if the property is not cleaned up.

Mr. Fortner stated that his department can write citations because they are sworn through the Sheriff as deputies, and with a third person, the department could handle the extra court caseload.

Mr. Leonard asked if the department is overwhelmed now with calls how would another full time employee help with the added court time.

Mr. Fortner stated that the officers are on call seven days a week, and if dispatch cannot get the officer on call on the phone, they call the other officer and there is no time off.

Mr. Kolb stated that Mr. Fortner had spoken with him about this and he suggested Mr. Fortner go ahead and begin writing litter citations, and the courts could stagger court days so that all officers are not in court on the same days.

Mr. Leonard stated that if the department is already overwhelmed it does not need the extra responsibility of litter enforcement.

Mr. Kolb asked if adding the full time position would help with the plan to euthanize cats.

Mr. Fortner stated it would, however; the officers have to become certified at the Academy and the Academy was cancelled due to COVID-19. He stated that one officer would need to be available at the Pound most of the day if the County decides to go that route.

Mr. Poe stated that the County might have to adopt an ordinance on cats before euthanization could be done.

Mr. Kolb asked if it is in the budget this year to make the part-time position fulltime.

Mr. Poe stated that the additional funds would have to come out of the general fund.

Mr. Leonard stated that this needs to be discussed at the budget meetings.

Mr. Kolb asked if the part-time hours could be increased.

Mr. Poe stated that this is the maximum hours that can be worked without having to provide benefits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Lee County Board of Supervisors hereby grants approval to the Lee County Department of Social Services to pay a one-time salary supplement of \$1,000.00 to each DSS employee during the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR REASSESSMENT OF REAL PROPERTY

Mr. Poe stated that the County is required to conduct a reassessment of real property prior to January 1, 2022. He recently advertised for proposals for these services and received three responses. He asked that this matter be taken up in closed session.

LOCAL ALLOCATIONS FOR FEDERAL CARES CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUNDS

Mr. Poe stated that he received information regarding Federal Coronavirus Relief Funds now available to localities through the Commonwealth of Virginia. The funds are intended for reimbursement of expenditures related to the COVID-19 pandemic incurred by localities between March 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020. Lee County's allocation is \$2,043,566.00; however, any funds drawn down and not used for qualified expenditures must be refunded to the State by December 30, 2020. The deadline to apply for these funds is May 22, 2020. There is a provision that a portion of the funding can be passed through the locality to incorporated towns and the locality takes the risk of maintaining eligibility of the expenditures. He has been in contact with the Town of Pennington and the Town indicated that should the County chose to provide funds to the Town that they would enter a Memorandum of Understanding with the County. Mr. Poe would recommend the Board authorize the drawdown request.

He added that having each department head submit a recommendation would be like going back to square one.

Mr. Kolb stated that we should go back to square one based on the current proposal adding that Mr. Cope's plan is far superior to the current proposal.

Mr. Leonard asked that the Board attend the meeting with the department heads.

It was moved by Mr. Kolb, seconded by Mr. Smith, to show two proposals to the department heads and have the Board there at that meeting. Upon the question being put the vote was as follows.

FUEL DISPENSER MACHINE AT AIRPORT

Mr. Kolb stated that the Board has discussed having VDOT attend the meetings and asked Mr. Poe if they were going to start attending the meetings.

Mr. Poe stated that VDOT is trying to get back to attending local meetings. Paul Matticks is the new Residency Administrator and he will begin attending the meetings quarterly and hopes to begin in June or July.

CAMERAS AT BLACKWATER CONVENIENCE CENTER

Mr. Kolb stated that he would like to start a pilot project at the Blackwater Convenience Center to test camera usage for catching illegal activity. Alan Bailey searched types of cameras that could be used to monitor the site. In order for the cameras to function and be able to record it would require internet. Blackwater Fire Department is next to the Convenience Center, but does not have internet. Mr. Kolb spoke to someone from the Fire Department and they would agree to split the cost of internet and phone, with the Fire Department paying \$40.00 and the County paying \$100.00. The hardware would be kept at the Fire Department with only the County having access.

Mr. Bailey stated that there would be an additional cost for wiring from the Fire Department to the Convenience Center and a security box for the DVR system.

Mr. Slemp asked where the cameras would be mounted.

Mr. Bailey stated he has not looked at the site so he is not sure how they would be mounted.

Mr. Mosley asked if there is a problem at the Blackwater site.

Mr. Kolb stated that Blackwater gets some waste from Tennessee, the man working the site is in his 80s and if the site can be monitored with cameras, there would be no need to pay someone to work 26 hours a week when he retires. -----

Mr. Leonard asked if there was a 24 month contract for the internet service.

Mr. Poe stated that the quote is for 36 months.

Mr. Kolb stated that the package could also be downgraded.

It was moved by Mr. Kolb, seconded by Mr. Smith, to approve a camera system at Blackwater Convenience Center subject to being able to get the internet contract to 24 months and subject to the County not paying more than \$100.00 per month and subject to the cable not being more than \$400.00. Upon the question being put the vote was as follows.

SURPLUS PROPERTY

Mr. Kolb asked if any surplus property has been sold yet.

WORKS PROGRAM

Mr. Kolb stated that there is a terrible drug problem in the County and we look to the State and Federal governments for solutions and it is time the County think about doing something to address the issue. The Works program goes hand in hand with that problem. He asked the Board's thoughts on the Works program handbook he gave out at the April meeting.

Mr. Slemp stated it is a good idea.

Mr. Kolb stated that the County needs to make a plan; who will work the program, where will it be housed, what space is available, how many people work in the program, what kind of work they will do in the program.

Mr. Leonard stated he does not like the idea of putting the program on the Litter Control Officer; it needs to be a separate position.

Mr. Poe stated that there is not an empty space in the Courthouse.

Mr. Kolb stated he would like the Board to consider what to do with the Extension Office.
