- Tax Parcel 28-(A)-30D containing approximately .009 ± acres in the Jasper community at the intersection of US Route 23 and State Route 611.

He obtained a proposal from Thompson and Litton for an analysis for possible renovations to the Circuit Court Clerks offices. After seeing the proposed price for the work, Mr. Poe requested additional detail on the costs. Mr. Houchins provided the following by email:

Architecture - \$7,866.00

This included a site visit, field measuring the spaces, creation of a floor plan for use by all disciplines for preliminary layouts, a cost estimate and narrative report. This could be reduced by \$2,000.00 if no floor plan is produced, however it will be required later if any design work by any discipline is performed.

Electrical Engineering - \$5,964.00

This includes a site visit, evaluation of existing electrical services and potential future needs, new lighting calculations and options, cost estimate and narrative report.

Mechanical Engineering - \$3,792.00

This includes a site visit, preliminary engineering for HVAC system selection and duct work layouts, cost estimate and narrative report.

Mr. Kolb stated that the main concern was just one office and stated he would like to look into a portable unit being installed in that office and exhausting into the hallway or into the basement.

Mr. Poe stated that everything has to be done by code and he would have to look into the matter.

The chair called a 5-minute recess.

The meeting was called back to order at 5:47 p.m.

UNITED WAY MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Mr. Poe provided the Board with a copy of a request from United Way of Southwest Virginia for Lee County to consider entering into a Memorandum of Understanding with UWSVA, which could potentially allow them to obtain FEMA reimbursement for services they are currently providing with respect to COVID relief efforts.

COMMONWEALTH ATTORNEY DEHUMIDIFIER

Mr. Poe stated that after last month's meeting, he visited the Commonwealth's Attorney office to see how the dehumidifier could be mounted in the restroom and drain into a sink to allow continuous operation as proposed by the Board. After looking at the overall situation, he does not believe this will help resolve the issue. There are currently five dehumidifiers operating in those offices, but none of them are in the Commonwealth Attorney's office. The closest one is in a hallway approximately ten feet from the doorway. If it is mounted in the bathroom, it will be even further from his office and the bathroom doors are typically left closed. Room dehumidifiers work well when operating in an enclosed room for which they are size rated; however, they will not circulate much air through doorways and down hallways.

Mr. Poe has previously discussed possible options with the HVAC maintenance contractor and the general consensus is to install a whole system dehumidifier. This is an expensive operation and, as dehumidifiers exhaust heat, it would further stress the cooling system during hot, humid weather. He will contact the contractor again to discuss other possible options to help remedy some of the humidity issues in the building, which are throughout the building.

Mr. Kolb asked how long humidity has been an issue.
Mr. Poe stated it has been an issue on for a long time.
Mr. Kolb asked when the last time a whole system dehumidifier was quoted.
Mr. Poe stated it has been a few years.
Mr. Kolb asked who would install the shelf.

Mr. Poe stated Gary Collingsworth.

Mr. Kolb stated that Mr. Cridlin's staff are dumping the dehumidifiers twice daily, the motion was to install the shelf and the Board voted to approve that, so move forward with installing it and move on with the other issues.

Mr. Poe stated he would get with Mr. Collingsworth to get the shelf installed as soon as his schedule permits.

Mr. Mosley recommended to change the setting on the air supply line.

PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX RELIEF RATE FOR 2020

Mr. Poe reported that this is an annual requirement to adjust the Personal Property Tax Relief based on the total number of vehicles based in Lee County. The rate for 2020 has been calculated by the Commissioner of the Revenue's office at 59.03%.

WHEREAS, the Personal Property Tax Relief Act of 1998, Va. Code 58.1-3523 et seq. ("PPTRA"), has been substantially modified by the enactment of Chapter 1 of the Acts of Assembly, 2004 Special Session I (Senate Bill 5005), and the provisions of Item 503 of Chapter 951 of the 2005 Acts of Assembly (the 2005 revisions to the 2005-06 Appropriations Act, hereinafter cited as the "2005 Appropriations Act"); and

WHEREAS, these legislative enactments require the County to take affirmative steps to implement these changes, and to provide for the computation and allocation of relief provided pursuant to the PPTRA as revised; and

WHEREAS, these legislative enactments provide for the appropriation to the County of a fixed sum to be used exclusively for the provision of tax relief to owners of qualifying personal use vehicles that are subject to the personal property tax on such vehicles;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Lee County Board of Supervisors that qualifying vehicles obtaining situs within the County during tax year 2020, shall receive personal property tax relief in the following manner:

- Personal use vehicles valued at \$100 to \$20,000 will be eligible for 59.03% tax relief;
- Personal use vehicles valued at \$20,001 or more shall only receive 59.03% tax relief on the first \$20,000 of value; and
- All other vehicles which do not meet the definition of "qualifying" (business use vehicles, farm use vehicles, motor homes, etc.) will not be eligible for any form of tax relief under this program.

TOWN OF PENNINGTON GAP CARES ACT REIMBURSEMENT REQUEST

Mr. Poe reported that he received a request from the Town of Pennington Gap for reimbursement under the CARES Act provided by the Commonwealth of Virginia. The total amount requested for reimbursement at this time is \$69,335.10.

Mr. Kolb asked about a contract or Memorandum of Understanding with the Town of Pennington Gap repaying the County if any expenses are deemed ineligible.

Mr. Poe stated there would need to be a contract drafted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Lee County Board of Supervisors hereby acknowledges and affirms its full support for this project for the FY2022 Six Year Improvement Program Cycle;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this Board does encourage and request the Commonwealth Transportation Board and Virginia Department of Transportation to fund the submitted project and does support any and all such efforts.

Mr. Slemp returned to the meeting.

SCHOOL BOARD REQUEST

Mr. Poe reported that he received a letter from the School Board requesting that the Board of Supervisors allocate all of the excess funds from Fiscal Year 2019-2020 in the amount of \$18,697.63 to the School Board Capital Reserve Fund. Mr. Poe stated that the agreement with the School Board is that 2/3 of the excess funds be allocated to the Capital Reserve Fund and 1/3 of the excess funds revert to the County's General Fund.

It was moved by Mr. Mosley, seconded by Mr. Slemp, to allocate the excess funds as previously agree, with 2/3 going into the School Board's Capital Reserve Fund and 1/3 going into the County's General Fund. Upon the question being put the vote was as follows.
